-"The things that we love tell us what we are."


-"The Eucharist is the Sacrament of Love; It signifies

#### From the Music Director

### St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor

Thomas d'Aquino was born into a noble Italian family in the early 13<sup>th</sup> century but left his family's wealth to join the newly founded Dominican Order. Studying at the University of Paris, he's been described as "the most influential thinker of the medieval period."

In his masterpiece, the *Summa Theologiæ*, Aquinas asks whether God should be praised with song. He states, "we need to praise God with our lips, not indeed for His sake, but for our own sake; since by praising Him our devotion is aroused towards Him, and so that the souls of the fainthearted may be the more incited to devotion."

At the request of Pope Urban IV, who instituted the feast of Corpus Christ in 1264, this great theologian contributed the text for the sequence before the Gospel, and the hymn *Pange, lingua* for processions with the Blessed Sacrament.



His original feast day was March 7<sup>th</sup>, the day of his death, but because this almost always falls within Lent, it was changed to January 28<sup>th</sup>, the date his relics were moved to the Church of the Jacobins in Toulouse, to ensure he could be honored and not superseded by Lent.



Our readings today remind us of God's authority.

As we reflect on our Gospel, we recognize that God possesses all authority and that we want to give Him all authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man.

Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer Who will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.




