



#### From the Music Director

### We Walk by Faith

Until the late 18<sup>th</sup> century, Christians, like Hebrews, sang mostly psalms during liturgy, with just a few hymns written for special occasions. But in the late 1700s hymn writing had really started to flourish and inspired by the line from 2 Corinthians 5:7, British theologian Henry Alford wrote "We Walk by Faith" when he was around 34 years old. It first appeared in *Psalms and Hymns Adapted to the Sundays and Holydays Throughout the Year of 1844*. His best-known hymn, which we'll be singing in a couple weeks, is "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come."

The tune we sing it to, ST. ANNE, was composed by William Croft while he was the organist of St. Anne's Church in London, hence the name of the tune. Originally intended to be sung with Psalm 62, it first appeared in the *Supplement to the New Version of the Psalms, 6th edition* in 1708. But many hymn writers started pairing this tune with their texts, most famously Isaac Watts with his "O God, Our Help in Ages Past." Its opening melodic motif was very popular and was used by Handel in his anthem "O Praise the Lord" and by J. S. Bach in his "Fugue in E flat," otherwise known as "St. Anne's Fugue."



## A Reflection from Love and Serve

## This Week's Readings | USCCB

The Way of a Pilgrim is the English title of a classic 1884 Russian, Eastern Orthodox Church spiritual book. The anonymous author, a Russian peasant, recounts his experience as he goes on a journey seeking to fully comprehend and put into practice Saint Paul's teaching to continuous prayer, "Pray without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians 5:17), specifically, the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." The book is both a spiritual manual and a testimony to the pilgrim's devotion to God. "The story of the Russian pilgrim is beautiful: it is a book that is accessible to all. I recommend you read it; it will help you to understand what vocal prayer is... [The words we speak] lead us by the hand towards the experience of God." (Pope Francis, General Audience, April 21, 2021). Repeatedly reciting the Jesus Prayer makes us aware of our human sinfulness and the mercy of Christ, our Savior. It is a humble cry for healing and forgiveness in the biblical tradition of Psalms and hymns. Repetition of the prayer cultivates a profound and continual consciousness of God's presence in our lives.

In today's Gospel, we meet Bartimaeus, a blind man who sits by the roadside begging. Rebuked and ostracized by the people around him but full of hope, he persists in crying out to Jesus upon hearing Him pass by, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me" (Mark 10:47b). The Jesus Prayer simulates Bartimaeus's cry, an invocation of Jesus's name recognizing Him as the Messiah and a plead for mercy. Bartimaeus' persistence imparts the importance of perseverance in prayer and faith while staying undeterred by societal pressures to silence those cries. In a demonstration of His compassion and answering the calls of those in need, Jesus stops and calls Bartimaeus to Him. St. Mark's account tells us that the blind beggar "threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus." Bartimaeus cast aside his burdens to answer the call of Christ. Upon asking for his sight, Jesus granted Bartimaeus his request and set him free to go for his faith saved him. The blind beggar was transformed by receiving his sight and became a follower of Jesus.

Bartimaeus' encounter with Jesus and the Jesus Prayer help us recognize that we need Jesus' mercy and redemption. They inspire us to persistently seek Him and respond to His call. Are there areas of blindness in our lives that need healing? Jesus is nearby, waiting for us to cry out to Him in faith. How will we respond to His call in our own lives?

Let us bring our needs to Jesus. Let us be persistent in our prayer and open to the transformative power of faith.

#### TALKING POINTS ON PROPOSITION 1

#### Proposition 1: Equal Protection of Law Amendment - how it will appear on the ballot:

"This proposal would protect against unequal treatment based on ethnicity, national origin, age, disability, and sex, including sexual orientation, gender identity and pregnancy. It also protects against unequal treatment based on reproductive healthcare and autonomy.

WHY OPPOSE PROPOSITION 1? Prop 1 could expand abortion access and reduce parental authority in decisions related to minors, particularly regarding gender-affirming treatments.

- Unrestricted Abortion: While the Equal Rights Amendment suggests equality, Catholics are urged to oppose Proposal 1, as it would permanently legalize unrestricted abortion in New York, potentially leading to harmful consequences for unborn children.
- Parental Rights at Risk: The amendment's language could strip parents of their rights over decisions
  regarding their children, particularly in matters such as "gender-affirming" treatments, transferring
  authority to courts.
- Dangerous Consequences: Proposal 1 could have lasting negative impacts on families and unborn
  children, serving political agendas while disregarding the sacred parent-child relationship and the
  protection of life.
- Girls Sports Threatened: Opponents say the law would also grant boys and men the right to compete in girls and women's sports, by elevating 'gender identity' to a constitutional right.

#### CATHOLIC RESPONSIBILITY

- Noting Responsibly: Catholics are encouraged to reflect on critical issues, educate themselves, and vote
  with an informed conscience to promote the common good on key moral issues such as the dignity of
  human life and social justice.
- Catholics Role in Politics: Catholics are encouraged to actively engage in the political process by voting and contributing to public policy discussions, while the Church remains non-partisan.
- Catholic Voices in Politics: The Church values the involvement of Catholics in various political parties to bring their faith-based perspectives to the discussion, guided by Gospel teachings.
- Pray the triudance: Catholics are encouraged to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance in their discernment
  of candidates and policies to foster leaders who support the common good.

#### CATHOLIC TEACHINGS

- The Cimreh's Morel Equipment on: The dignity of every human person, from conception to natural death, is central to the Church's political and social stance, informing its opposition to issues like abortion, euthanasia, and racism.
- Human Rightseand Right to life: The right to life is seen as foundational, and without it, other rights
  cannot stand. Without the protection of life, other rights become vulnerable and lose their significance.
  Without the right to life, the pursuit of liberty, justice, and human dignity is impossible, as every other
  human right depends on the basic right to exist and be protected from harm.

USCCB GUIDANCE - The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has provided the document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" to help guide Catholics in their voting decisions, encouraging them to reflect on the truth of the Gospel.

#### Dear St. Kevin Parishioners.

This year as we go to the election booth to vote for our new president and other candidates for federal, state, and local office, we are called to make the best choice from those individuals available on the ballot. As good citizens we have the responsibility to choose the candidates that will best represent the shared values of our community and who will promote the common good for all.

Our democratic republic is founded on the idea that there are inalienable rights, which are given to all human beings as a part of our created dignity. These rights need to be protected while considering the many perceived goods of both the majority and minority groups in our national and local communities, that constitute the rich fabric of our nation.

We entrust our representatives to debate and advocate for us. In senate chambers, congressional halls, board rooms, and civic offices the deliberations of government shape our laws and frame the civil context of our lives.

Therefore, the representatives we choose should be individuals who can effectively represent us, their constituents, while keeping the common good of everyone in a delicate balance. The selection of our new representatives is an important process that requires much discernment.

As members of the Catholic community of St. Kevin, Flushing, the personal deliberation we undertake should move us to reflect on critical issues that affect us and our ability to freely exercise our Christian faith. Each of us has an obligation to know the teachings of our faith and educate ourselves on how these beliefs and values inform a Christian world view. This process encourages us to vote with an informed conscience. This means our choice takes into consideration the common good, not just personal preference or gain, as well as the teaching of the Church on key moral issues and social justice.

In your deliberation, I invite you to inform yourself with the candidates that are on our ballot here in Flushing and consider how they align themselves with the rich traditions, customs, and values of the Catholic community to which you belong. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has provided the document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" to help guide Catholics in their voting decisions, encouraging them to reflect on the truth of the Gospel; the link to the document is as follows: https://www.usccb.org/issues-and-action/faithful-citizenship/upload/forming-consciences-for-faithful-citizenship.pdf.

Also, on the ballot in New York State this November there will be many different propositions to consider. Proposition 1 is a proposal to amend the State Constitution that could expand abortion access and reduce parental authority in decisions related to minors. This proposal is in direct opposition to the Catholic Church's teaching on the sanctity of human life, which begins at conception and ends with natural death. It is also a gross overreach by civil government into family life and the rights of parents to care for and provide for their children. Proposition 1 is a politically driven agenda that does little to protect the common good, especially the goodness of life and care to the most innocent and vulnerable of our community. As a community of faith, The Bishops of New York State, have asked that we vote NO to Proposition 1. Their letter can be found at the following link: https://www.nyscatholic.org.

I pray that as we approach the November election, it will be a time of true and prayerful deliberation. As we make our selection, may the proposals we pick and individuals we choose for public service be those who by their words and example call each of us to be better individuals, saints of God.
