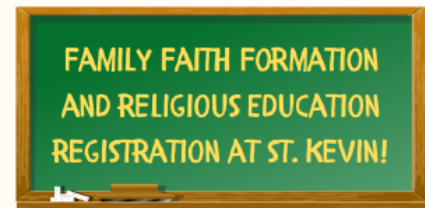

WHO NEEDS TO REGISTER?

Flag Day

Flag Day commemorates the Continental Congress's official adoption of the "Stars and Stripes" design as the national flag on June 14, 1777. Calling for 13 alternating red and white stripes and 13 white stars on a blue field, or canton, representing a "new constellation"; most historians credit its design to Francis Hopkinson, a New Jersey delegate to the Continental Congress who signed the Declaration of Independence. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation designating June 14 as Flag Day, and in 1949 it was officially established by an Act of Congress.

The New York City Flag Day Parade is one of the longest running parades in our city. It ends at a Grandstand just outside the steps of Fraunces Tavern®, a historic landmark and the oldest bar in the city, known as the watering hole for many of the founding fathers.

The Catholic Church views love of one's country as an extension of piety. Just as individuals owe honor and gratitude to our parents, we owe respect to the nation that provides the cultural and societal structures for community life. We are encouraged to be faithful citizens and pray for our nation, especially on this 250th anniversary year. But google how to display the flag properly. You'd be surprised how many people and civic organizations make mistakes!

In one year of Pope Leo XIV's papacy, we've seen clear pastoral emphasis on mercy, evangelization, peace, and the Church's engagement with indubitable human needs. The Pope pursued initiatives that touched both ecclesial governance and matters of culture and faith formation. Regarding Gaza, the Pope shared the Vatican's vision for a two-state solution and a faster pace of the peace process. He hoped for a truce in Ukraine and met with young people in Lebanon and brought them God's message of peace. He visited nations on three continents, spotlighting people's need for education and healthcare; spoke about the Church's cooperation with governments toward building new hospitals and new facilities; and stressed the Church's responsibility to recognize and promote human rights. He called Catholic Charities agencies in the U.S. "agents of hope," highlighting their material services of food, shelter, medical care, and legal assistance for migrants and refugees, and publicly criticized the war with Iran and rejected any religious language used to justify it. His first encyclical, Magnifica Humanitas, called for safeguarding the human person in the age of artificial intelligence.

By leading the Church and recentering humanity's focus on human needs, the Pope is living the movement given to us in today's lectionary: God gathers, God names, God heals, and God sends. Let's explore today's readings.

In Exodus, God commands Moses to remind the Israelites of His commission: "*You will be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.*" —Exodus 19:6. God set apart Israel as a priestly kingdom and a holy nation, consecrating the people for witness and worship. The Church teaches that the baptized share Christ's priestly vocation, distinct from the ordained ministerial priesthood, so that they may offer spiritual sacrifices and proclaim Christ everywhere on earth. Saint Paul in today's New Testament reading reminds us that God's divine love is shown in that "*God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.*" And "*we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.*" —Romans 5:8, 11. Jesus' death and reconciliation are a grace for a humanity that is incapable of rescuing itself from sin. The Gospel reading recounts Jesus looking at the crowd and being moved with compassion for them "*because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.*" Matthew 9:36. Jesus summons His twelve disciples, the number is not random but evokes the twelve tribes of Israel, and commissions them to proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is at hand.

Putting the lectionary's pieces together, their formation becomes clear. Exodus gives identity and commission to the Israelites and, by grace, to us Christians as we are grafted onto them; Romans reminds us that Christ died for us while we were still sinners; and Matthew sends us forth into the world to proclaim that "*the kingdom of heaven is at hand.*" Our faith should not be shrunk into private devotion; the Church has been commissioned to bear witness to Christ everywhere on earth.

DAMIEN HOUSE

The weekend of June 27th & June 28th Mr. Paul Franzetti will be here for the Mission Appeal. He will be speaking about the work of Damien House. Please take a moment to read about the incredible work this mission is doing in Ecuador.

Damien House is a residential hospital for over 30 Hansen's patients, and in addition treats a roster of around 700 outpatients, in Guayaquil, Ecuador. Quality medical care is provided seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day. With the help of donations to the US-based Damien House organization, the staff is also able to provide patients with dental care, physical and occupational therapy, sanitary services, medication, and three well-balanced hot meals every day. Additionally, Damien House has a community outreach program that helps those who have been treated and cured to secure a home, find work, and participate in community activities so that they may return to living full lives.

The work of Damien House extends far beyond the hospital's walls. The staff makes regular visits within Guayaquil and in remote villages, providing public education about the cause and curability of Hansen's Disease and spreading optimism for its eventual elimination.

Damien House used to be associated with the Hospital for Infectious Diseases. Originally, Damien House was the Hansen's disease wing of the hospital. Recently Sister Annie has been able to separate Damien House from the hospital. Making ourselves independent allows us to have the final say in treatment and care. This means that no-one will ever be asked to leave Damien House. Unfortunately, it has also caused an increase in expenses due to the increase in utility bills. The increased cost is something we are happy to pay for to make sure everyone here receives the best possible love and care.

The heart of Damien House is Sister Annie Credidio, of the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, B.V.M., who has dedicated her life to bringing care and dignity to Hansen's patients. In the late 1980s, Annie began volunteering in the Hansen's wing of one of Guayaquil's hospitals, teaching arts and crafts to the patients. As she formed relationships with the staff and residents, she realized she and the hospital could do much more to dispel the misery in these patients' lives. In the early 1990s, Sister Annie and other hospital volunteers reorganized the Hansen's (leprosy) wing to form Damien House, hoping to transform the lives of patients with Hansen's Disease. Through her vision and leadership, Damien House has restored the health, hope and confidence of several thousand patients and involved family members. In 1994, Annie founded the U.S.-based Damien House charitable organization, which invites donors to join the effort to bring hope and dignity to the lives of Hansen's patients. In addition to running the hospital, Sister Annie spends several months of the year traveling in the U.S. to seek the funding that keeps Damien House open.

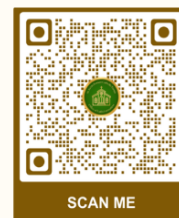
