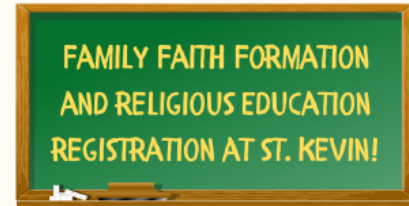
## Family Faith Formation and Religious Education

#### WHO NEEDS TO REGISTER?

## From the Music Director

## Faith of Our Fathers

This hymn was written by Father Frederick William Faber, an English Anglican priest who converted to Catholicism. He originally wrote it as a tribute to the English and Irish Catholic martyrs who resisted King Henry VIII establishing the Church of England. Their refusal to abandon the Pope or Catholic traditions caused them to suffer imprisonment and execution during the Protestant Reformation in 16<sup>th</sup>-century England. This hymn first appeared in Faber's 1849 publication *Jesus and Mary; or, Catholic Hymns for Singing and Reading*.

In the U.S., it is almost exclusively sung to the tune ST. CATHERINE, composed by English organist Henri F. Hemy in 1864. He composed it in honor of Catherine of Alexandria, a 4<sup>th</sup>-century lady put to death because of her faith. But it wasn't until 1874 — a full 25 years after Faber wrote the text and 10 years after Hemy composed the hymn tune that another composer, James Walton, wrote the refrain and adapted the text to the tune.



Did you know this hymn was recorded by Bing Crosby for his 1945 album *Merry Christmas*?

Jeremiah was a major prophet in the Kingdom of Judah during the late seventh and early sixth centuries B.C. Born into a priestly family, he accepted God's call to prophecy and embarked on a tumultuous ministry that lasted nearly half a century. His life was marked by opposition, imprisonment, and personal suffering. Central to Jeremiah's message were warnings of impending divine judgment. He called out the nation's idolatry, social injustices, and moral decay, urging the people to repent before disaster struck. Yet the people did not receive his words as a warning; they saw them as a threat that had to be silenced. For reasons that were both religious and political, they turned against him, seized him, and demanded his death. Although Jeremiah survived multiple arrests and periods of imprisonment, his story ended with martyrdom; he is traditionally said to have been stoned in Egypt. Although Jeremiah felt *"Terror on every side,"* fear did not diminish his faith in God or fidelity to His calling.

A life of steadily increasing trials and sorrows did not lead Jeremiah to doubt, question, or dilute his message. Instead, he found peace and proclaimed, *"The Lord is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not prevail."* —Jeremiah 20:11. Fear can be a paralyzing emotion. We have all encountered fear and, at times, have been overcome by it. It can make us hesitant to speak, move, and act as we ought to. In today's Gospel, the Lord commands us not to be afraid, not because He will make our trials and sorrows go away, but because we should be fearful of something else that is even more consequential: *"Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna."* —Matthew 10:28. Jesus makes a crucial distinction between fear of the things of the world, which, of course, can bring real anxiety and distress, and the fear of the Lord, which gives proper perspective. Lest this command to holy fear cause the disciples to despair, Christ immediately balances His warning with a tender assurance of divine providence: *"Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge."* —Matthew 10:29. As Jeremiah had, let us recognize God as our champion. We should be at peace even as we suffer fear of the things of this world because the grace of God and our fidelity to Him promise us eternal life.

In the midst of great fear, to whom do we turn? Let us spend time this week thinking of the things we fear: illness, suffering, death, failure, financial insecurity, loss of control, rejection, judgment, and humiliation. Then, let us bring our fears and anxieties to God in prayer. Let us ask Him what we should do and trust in Him while we wait for His answer, for these are all things of this world. Let us be mindful that fear is grounded in not trusting in God, our Heavenly Father. God cannot fail to love us, for He truly is love. Jesus in today's Gospel reminds us that even the hairs of our head are numbered. Let this be our prayer: *"I need nothing but God, and to lose myself in the heart of Jesus."* —Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque.

## DAMIEN HOUSE

The weekend of June 27<sup>th</sup> & June 28<sup>th</sup> Mr. Paul Franzetti will be here for the Mission Appeal. He will be speaking about the work of Damien House. Please take a moment to read about the incredible work this mission is doing in Ecuador.

Damien House is a residential hospital for over 30 Hansen's patients, and in addition treats a roster of around 700 outpatients, in Guayaquil, Ecuador. Quality medical care is provided seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day. With the help of donations to the US-based Damien House organization, the staff is also able to provide patients with dental care, physical and occupational therapy, sanitary services, medication, and three well-balanced hot meals every day. Additionally, Damien House has a community outreach program that helps those who have been treated and cured to secure a home, find work, and participate in community activities so that they may return to living full lives.

The work of Damien House extends far beyond the hospital's walls. The staff makes regular visits within Guayaquil and in remote villages, providing public education about the cause and curability of Hansen's Disease and spreading optimism for its eventual elimination.

Damien House used to be associated with the Hospital for Infectious Diseases. Originally, Damien House was the Hansen's disease wing of the hospital. Recently Sister Annie has been able to separate Damien House from the hospital. Making ourselves independent allows us to have the final say in treatment and care. This means that no-one will ever be asked to leave Damien House. Unfortunately, it has also caused an increase in expenses due to the increase in utility bills. The increased cost is something we are happy to pay for to make sure everyone here receives the best possible love and care.

The heart of Damien House is Sister Annie Credidio, of the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, B.V.M., who has dedicated her life to bringing care and dignity to Hansen's patients. In the late 1980s, Annie began volunteering in the Hansen's wing of one of Guayaquil's hospitals, teaching arts and crafts to the patients. As she formed relationships with the staff and residents, she realized she and the hospital could do much more to dispel the misery in these patients' lives. In the early 1990s, Sister Annie and other hospital volunteers reorganized the Hansen's (leprosy) wing to form Damien House, hoping to transform the lives of patients with Hansen's Disease. Through her vision and leadership, Damien House has restored the health, hope and confidence of several thousand patients and involved family members. In 1994, Annie founded the U.S.-based Damien House charitable organization, which invites donors to join the effort to bring hope and dignity to the lives of Hansen's patients. In addition to running the hospital, Sister Annie spends several months of the year traveling in the U.S. to seek the funding that keeps Damien House open.

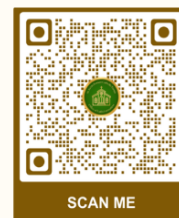
